TEAMWORK IN NATURE?

Just like the workers in AFG, nature has its own teams. A great example are Bees! Hundreds, sometimes thousands of bees live in a hive; these groups are called colonies. Every single bee has a role to play to make sure the hive is healthy and makes plenty of honey!



BUSY BEES IN THE OFFICE

What role would you have in a team like AFG? Read below to see how each job at AFG is similar to the jobs bees do within their colony.



Queen Bee CEO & Management

The *Queen Bee* is in charge of the hive making sure the colony grows and is healthy, just like **AFG's CEO**. There is only one Queen Bee per hive.

Some Worker Bees are her attendants, helping to manage smaller groups of worker bees and their different tasks. The Queen attendants are like the **President and Vice Presidents** of a company like AFG.





Worker Bee Employees

Just like their name, workers do lots of work around the hive. They are like the many employees at AFG.

Nurses take care of new larvae, just as *HR* takes care of new employees and makes sure they have everything they need.

Foragers are the ones that find pollen and nectar, just like *Business Developers* who find more opportunities for AFG.

Architects build and fix any damage to the hive. They are like the employees that work on the job site as architects, construction managers, designers, and inspectors.

Cleaners, Organizers and Honey Makers collect pollen & nectar from the foragers and turn it into honey. *Marketing* takes information from employees and their jobs, turns it into news, and spreads the word about AFG.



Drone Bee Office Administrators

Drone bees are very important — their whole purpose is to keep the entire species alive.

Drones are similar to the accountants, office and business administrators in that they make sure the inner workings of the is running smoothly.

A RESU-WHAT?

A resume is a record of your skills, accomplishments, and experience working. It is a very important tool when you start looking for a job. Your resume is the first chance to impress the boss — a chance to show what you are capable of and why you would be a good fit for their team.





WHAT'S IN A RESUME?

First, and most importantly, the 'About You'. This includes your full name, a way to contact you, and a little about what makes you, you. You want the employer to know who they are reading about, and be able to reach out to you. For this exercise, we can leave out the contact information.

Second, let them know how smart you are! You can include what level you're at in school, and what school(s) you went to. Your good grades and level at school shows that you are dedicated to improving your mind. This is no easy task, and employers know it.



Third, you need to list and explain all your skills and work experience. You can find skills in everything you do.

- Have you ever cleaned your whole room by yourself? *You have organizational skills.*
- Have you helped your parent/guardian set up for a party? *You have assisted in event planning.*
- Do you play an instrument or a sport? You've shown dedication and an ability to continue improving your skills.
- Are you captain of your sports team? You have leadership skills.
- Do you speak multiple languages? You have an agile mind, and are able to talk to people from other countries.



Take 10 minutes to share your resume with your parent/guardian, and then have them interview you for your ideal job to see if you'd be a good fit.




Questions they might ask you could be:

- What excites you the most about being a member of this team?




Break Time

The bees are frazzled after a long day at work, can you help them in the activities below?





Bees Can Do

While working in a team, it's important to have a "Can Do" attitude — just like the Seabees who believe they can build just about anything, anywhere.

WHAT IS A SEABEE?

Is it a bee that lives in the sea? No! Is it even a real kind of bee? No!

A Seabee is a member of the U.S. Navy that works in the Construction Battalion ("CB"). Their job is to build bases, bulldoze and pave roadways and airstrips, and many other construction projects that the Navy may need.

They are architects, engineers, and construction workers, that serve the United States in times of war and peace.



The "Fighting Bee" is the official logo of the U.S. Navy Seabees. Based on the picture, what all do you think a Seabee can do?

- Stickers or decorations (optional)




The Bee's Knees




- How many of these plants do you recognize? Have you ever eaten some of the herbs above?
- What do you think would attract new workers into the Architectural, Engineering, and Construction (AEC) hive?






